Terms and Conditions

The Terms and Conditions detailed below apply to all riders participating in the St Albans Charity Cycle Ride, organised by the Rotary Clubs of St Albans.

Completion of an Event Registration Form and payment of an entry fee by (or on behalf of) the rider (“you”) acknowledges acceptance of these Terms and Conditions.

A. GENERAL TERMS & CONDITIONS

1. You enter the event at your own risk. So far as the law allows the Organisers, including all Route Marshals, helpers, officials, sponsors, Rotary International, and the Rotary Clubs of St Albans, are not responsible for any accident, loss, injury or public liability arising from or in any way connected to the event however incurred.
2. The event takes place on a public highway and you are responsible for riding safely on the road at all times, without endangering yourself or other road users.
3. You accept that the event you are entering is not a race in any format.
4. The Event Registration Form and payment of the entry fee must be completed by a person aged 18 years or over. Evidence of age must be provided on request.
5. Riders under the age of 18 will be allowed to participate in the event with the consent of their parent or legal guardian who must complete the appropriate section of the Event Registration Form. In doing so the parent or guardian accepts responsibility for the actions and consequences of the under-age rider. Under 14's must be accompanied by an adult who is responsible for them at all times.
6. You are required to ensure that the bicycle you are riding for the event and all of your equipment are of a suitable standard and in a good state of roadworthiness. Retrieval and minor repair facilities will be available, but we recommend that you carry basic tools, a pump and a puncture repair outfit.
7. If you use an e-bike, this must be fully compliant with UK law. E-bike riders should be aware of the bicycle's battery range and if necessary carry a spare battery.
8. We reserve the right to refuse entry to the event to anyone with inappropriate equipment or clothing. You are advised to carry lightweight rain protection, a drink and light snacks.



9. Upon completing the Event Registration Form, you agree that you are physically and mentally capable of riding the distance you have chosen. If during the event you decide to change your route or distance, you do so at your own risk.

10. During the event you will encounter warning signs at appropriate points on the lanes and roads. The absence of these signs does not signal that there are no dangers approaching.

11. We reserve the right to shorten or alter the published route at any time. Such action does not afford to you the right of cancellation.

12. If you fail to complete your chosen route for any reason, you are requested to return to or call the Ride Control Centre at Oaklands College (0300 3652260) before the close of the event.

B. RULES

13. You must check in at Registration before commencing the ride. At check in your Identification Bar Code will be scanned. This should then be attached to clothing so that it is visible to the Route Marshals.

14. **You are required to wear a safety-approved cycling helmet.** Any rider not wearing a helmet will not be covered by the event insurance and will not be allowed to participate. You must accept this as a condition of entry.

15. You must adhere to and obey the Highway Code, local by-laws and the laws of England. You should extend all reasonable courtesy to other road users. If you get into difficulty you should call the Ride Control Centre (0300 3652260) or ask another cyclist to inform the nearest Route Marshal and wait for assistance. Dial 999 first in case of serious accident or emergency.

16. You are requested to ride in single file where appropriate and no more than 2 abreast at any time. Please be aware of your fellow cyclists, other road users, and any other traffic and always indicate your intention to stop or change direction. You must avoid leaving your bicycle where it might obstruct the public highway.

17. You must not drop or leave any litter on any part of the route but dispose of it responsibly at an appropriate place or bin.

18. You are expected to respect the roads, villages and countryside that the routes travel through. It should be remembered that this is both a working landscape and home to many communities.

19. You are responsible for arranging your own sponsors, collecting sponsored monies and remitting this money to the St Albans Charity Cycle Ride account. Sponsorship monies should be sent to us by 17th June 2020

20. Late Entry. You may enter on the day, until 9:15am for 30/40 mile riders and 10:30am for 10/20 mile riders. Please refer to the WEB site for details of Late Registration Fees.



C. INSURANCE

21. Participation in the event is at your own risk.

22. The Organisers have arranged Third Party Insurance cover. Non-Compliance with the rules could void any subsequent claim.

23. We strongly recommend each rider organises their own personal insurance cover.

D. RECORDINGS

24. By participating in the event, you confirm and agree that we and third parties authorised by us may record you via photographs, film, audio, audio-visual or other recording, still or moving, during the event ("Recordings"). We shall own all rights in such recordings and you hereby (i) assign to us any and all present and future copyright, performance rights and any other right, title and interest in and to the Recordings and you hereby waive the benefit of any law known as "moral rights"; (ii) agree that we may use the Recordings for any purpose at our sole discretion including in any marketing and/or publicity materials, and on any website and social media; and (iii) agree that the Recordings may be altered, edited and/or modified (e.g. combined with other images, text, graphics and/or sound). You hereby release us from any and all liability from such use and promotion and specifically waive any right to any compensation you may have for appearing in any of the Recordings.

E. CANCELLATIONS

25. The Organisers reserve the right to cancel the event due to extreme weather conditions. In such circumstances we will use reasonable endeavours to re-schedule the event. Your entry will be automatically entered into the re-scheduled event.

26. Where a rider fails to start the ride by 10:30am for whatever reason no entrance fee will be refunded. The fee will be applied towards the charitable purposes of SACCR after deduction of expenses.

F. YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION

27. We will only use your personal information as set out in our Privacy Policy.

G. APPLICABLE LAW

28. The laws of England and Wales will apply to any proceedings arising in relation to this event.
